The National Safety Council (NSC)® Rising Stars of Safety program gives national recognition to individuals younger than 40 who have stepped up as leaders to transform their organizations' safety cultures and promote continuous safety improvement.

Nominate an up-and-coming safety leader as a Rising Star of Safety

Deadline: May 31, 2011

Nomination Criteria

- Younger than 40 years old, as of December 31, 2011
- 5+ years direct safety experience and some level of safety oversight
- Demonstrated safety leadership, with practical examples of:
 - ~ Leadership attributes that set the nominee apart from his or her peers
 - ~ Initiating and/or leading a successful safety initiative with measurable results
 - ~ Engaging peers and transforming the safety culture of the organization
 - ~ Valuing safety as a critical part of business operations

Selections are made through a blind evaluation of nominations.

Please note: While nominations must be submitted by an individual other than the nominee, the best submissions happen when nominator and nominee work together to complete the form.

Recognition of honorees

If selected, your nominee will receive national recognition from the nation's premier safety advocate, the NSC. Plus, your organization will garner industry-wide recognition of its safety leadership.

The Rising Stars of Safety Class of 2011 will receive recognition through:

- The 2011 NSC Congress & Expo, Oct. 30 – Nov. 4 in Philadelphia
- A feature story in the October 2011 issue of Safety+Health® magazine
- The NSC website
- Nationally circulated press releases
- Additional opportunities throughout the year

Honorees and their organizations will be notified in early August.

The fine print

- Nominations will only be accepted through the [online form](#), April 15 – May 31, 2011.
- The response to each criteria question must be 150 words or less.
- Nominee resume and head-shot photo (300 dpi or greater) must be submitted with the form for consideration.
- Nominations must come from an individual other than the safety professional being considered.
- Only one honoree will be chosen per company.
- International nominations are accepted and encouraged.
