



Are Your Riggers and Signalpersons Qualified?

To be deemed “qualified,” all signalpersons must be tested through a practical test and a written or oral test, and the qualification must be documented. Similar to signalpersons, riggers must also now meet OSHA’s criteria for a “qualified person” to be considered a “qualified rigger”. While OSHA allows for a four-year implementation period for Crane Operators to be certified under a new rule published August 2010, **the requirements for Riggers and Signalpersons to be qualified took effect November 8, 2010.**
