POISONING RISKS

Children or pets may be accidentally poisoned by swallowing medicine.



AVAILABILITY

More than **50% of people** who misuse opioid pain relievers obtain them from family or friends without permission



MEDICATION SHELF-LIFE

Some medications degrade over time and some can become ineffective or even harmful.



SUICIDE ATTEMPTS

Prescription drugs and over-the-counter medications accounted for 94% of emergency room visits related to suicide attempts in 2009.



Using someone else's medicine or your own unused medicine may hide symptoms and possibly delay treatment of a serious medical problem.





DON'T FLUSH

These drugs enter our streams, rivers and lakes harming wildlife and the environment.
