

SECUL-SECURITY SERVICES

With the NDSC's Emergency Operations Planning Program, your staff will be able to recognize potential security problems and react in case of an emergency.

TEACHER COURSE

Course Length: 4 hours

Increase your staff's level of safety and preparedness in the event of an emergency or violent act. During this course, they will learn the history of school shootings, lessons learned from each event, and if your school is at risk for violence. The instructor will cover predator recognition and observation techniques, staff preparedness suggestions, identification of potentially dangerous students, and the importance of developing an Emergency Response Plan.

ADMINISTRATOR COURSE

Course Length: 8 hours

Although schools are not traditional response organizations, when a school-based emergency occurs, school personnel respond immediately. This course will help administrative staff develop a comprehensive emergency response plan. By having a plan in place to keep students and staff safe, schools can take proactive steps to stop an emergency from occurring, or reduce the impact of an incident.

FACILITY ALL-THREAT ASSESSMENT

Approximately 20-24 hours

Our school security and emergency preparedness assessments are designed to help educators be proactive, not reactive, with school safety. We will provide an independent appraisal of safety measures already in place, and recommendations for enhancing those measures with improvements at the building and district levels.

At the conclusion of the assessment, you will receive a formal copy of the assessment and a report, designed as a strategic planning tool, that will include district-specific recommendations to address your school's unique concerns and needs.

School leaders use our security and preparedness assessments in multiple ways:

- Risk management tool for reducing crime and violence threats, risks, and potential liability while strengthening emergency preparedness.
- School-community relations tool to demonstrate a district's commitment to security prior to a crisis.
- Documentation of school district needs in advance of a levy campaign, or as part of a grant proposal.
